COVID-19 Preparedness Plan

Summer 2021

Masks: Masks are encouraged, but not required on school transportation vehicles. School transportation vehicles will be sanitized daily.

Health Screening Process: If you're sick, stay home. All people entering Hancock School facilities this summer are expected to perform a self-health screening (attached) prior to entering the building (screening for elementary children must be completed by an adult).

Isolation: If an individual tests positive for COVID-19, he/she must quarantine for 10 days during the infectious period.

Communication: Families are required to report a positive case of COVID-19 to the program director/principal. Families of the program (band, summer ag, athletics, etc.) will be notified of a positive COVID-19 case.

Attendance/Rosters: Daily attendance will be documented for each class/activity.

Contact Tracing: Families will be notified if their child has been exposed to a positive COVID-19 case.

Quarantine: In the event of an exposure, Hancock School encourages, but does not require, a quarantine period. The CDC recommends a 14-day quarantine period, with two other options: (1) 7-day quarantine period (test on day 5 or after) or (2) 10-day quarantine period without a test. If a person is vaccinated a quarantine period does not apply.

Household Contacts: Any person who lives in the same household as the person that tested positive is required to quarantine. See quarantine information above for details.

Other Mitigation Strategies: Hancock School will continue to use hand hygiene practices, cleaning and disinfecting protocols, and enhancing indoor air ventilation to prevent the spread of COVID-19.
